Lagoon Update

The new lagoon is progressing very quickly. We were informed by the contractor that the new lagoon and lift station should be up and operational this year, rather than 2020, as was originally estimated.

Building Permits

If you are planning any new construction or renovations to your property (including decks, fences, etc.), you require a building permit **PRIOR** to any construction commencing. Contact the Town Office for more information and to fill out a building permit application.

ATV's & Dirt Bikes

The law regarding ATV's & dirt bikes states that they are **NOT ALLOWED** within town limits and, if stopped by the RCMP, you may be charged. The Town has been tolerant with the use of ATV's for yard work etc. **ONLY!**

Please respect your neighbours by taking ATV's, dirt bikes and snowmobiles out of town limits in the quietest manner by the most direct route.

Flood Update

The Town would like to thank all the volunteers who were out helping during the flooding. **The Town would ask for citizens to refrain from connecting your sump pump to the sewer, and instead run it to the street during a flood!** The sewers are already experiencing high volumes of water, and putting more water into the sewer can potentially back them up into basements.

The Town would also ask for citizens to refrain from unnecessarily driving on the streets when they are under water! This can cause unnecessary property damage to homeowners, and you can be charged with unwillful damage.

The Town needs volunteers during these times for tasks ranging from helping out on the street moving water to logistical volunteers to help with planning in the Office.
